I. OPEN SESSION:

1. MINUTES:

- Upon a motion duly made and seconded it was voted to approve the minutes of March 28, 2019
 - VOTE: PASSES UNAMIMOUSLY

2. CORRESPONDENCE:

- Chairman Cross said Capt. Lawrence's and Capt. Lawrence's mother reached out to him to thank the HFD commissioners for attending the calling hours of his father's and her husband's funeral

3. STREET LIGHTS:

- Commissioner Atsalis stated that he still had not heard back from Duffy Health Center regarding if it is going to pay for the additional line that is needed for the possible new street light
- Commissioner Sullivan said that Pontiac Street needs the requested street light and Commissioner Atsalis said that he agreed and he would do the follow up with Mr. Viola who requested the new street light

5. NEW BUSINESS:

- a. Building Committee Report
 - Chairman Cross stated that the new building project is still under budget and Phase 3 is close to being completed
 - All staging is down except for the training tower
 - Temporary doors are up while the Bay 4 wall is being deconstructed
 - Chairman Cross said that he requested the work-area clean up to be continue

- b. Policy Digital Message Board
 - The firehouse sign will be an electric sign, but it will not rotate and it will only post notifications that deal with HFD business
 - The Policy for the Electronic Message Board is as follows:
 The Chief of the Department shall be the Custodian of the electronic message board located at the Department Headquarters,
 95 High School Extension. Messages will provide information to the public directly related to the operation of fire, rescue and
 - Upon a motion duly made and seconded it was voted to approve the Policy for the Electronic Message Board as read into the record

emergency services provided by the Department.

- VOTE: PASSES UNAMIMOUSLY
- c. Budget FY 2020
 - Referring to Treasurer LaFleur 's earlier comment in the Worshop Meeting on 041119 regarding the ambulance fund she stated that itwas now at \$2,500,000 (USD) as of 041119
 - The year-over-year growth in the ambulance fund is due to the hiring of a new company to handle Accounts Receivables
 - Free Cash will be set at \$600,000 (USD) for FY20
 - Chairman Cross said the proposed changes to the FY20 budget were the following:
 - 1. Commissioner Expense line item reallocation of \$10,000 (USD) to Chief's budget to help fund 4^{th} civilian employee
 - 2. Amended street light reallocation of \$10,000 (USD) to help fund possible Board of Commissioners' pay increase
 - 3. Amended Clerk/Treasurer line item reallocation of \$12,500 (USD) to Chief's budget to help fund 4th civilian employee
 - Chairman Cross requested a combined budget review sheet (Chief's budget and Clerk/Treasurer's budget) going forward
 - Commissioner Sullivan said he will ask Treasurer La Fleur to attend the meeting on Wednesday, April 18, 2019 at 5 PM
 - Chairman Cross said we should recess until Wednesday, April 18, 2019, review the requested combined budget and then vote on accepting FY20 budget

- EMS Supervisor Mike Medeiros and Chief Burke participated in the Boston Marathon Full Emergency drills at MEMA
- EMS Supervisor Medeiros participated in the chemical training and Chief Burke participated in the SWAT training
- In May 2019, the team will be taking part in the Coast Guard and Hy-Line Cruises Security Attack Drill
 - The HFD boat will be used in the training
 - This exercise will help reinforce across-agency teamwork
